



LIST OF CHEMICALS RELEASED For Chemical Facility Anti-Terrorism Standards

On November 2, 2007, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) released the final Appendix A list of chemicals under the Chemical Facility Anti-Terrorism Standards. The list contains approximately 300 chemicals of interest and is available online at <http://www.dhs.gov/chemicalsecurity>. The publication of this list imposes an affirmative duty on you to determine if your facility contains chemicals that are on this list.

The list will be published in the Federal Register shortly. Once it is published, facilities will have sixty (60) calendar days from the date of publication to:

1. Determine whether they have chemicals of interest onsite at or above the listed screening threshold quantities.
2. If a screening threshold quantity is triggered, complete the DHS Top-Screen consequence assessment survey, which is also available online at <http://www.dhs.gov/chemicalsecurity>.

There is also an ongoing obligation to complete a DHS Top-Screen consequence assessment survey within sixty (60) days of newly possessing a listed chemical at or above the screening threshold quantity.

DHS plans to use the completed Top-Screen consequence assessment survey to determine whether a particular facility poses a high level of security risk. Facilities determined by DHS to pose such a security risk will be subject to further regulation under the Chemical Facility Anti-Terrorism Standards at 6 C.F.R. Part 27.
